



# 2026 School Charges and Contributions

### **Dear Parents and Caregivers**

The Education Act 1999 requires schools to notify parents of all contributions and charges prior to the start of the school year. These costs are divided into four areas: School Charges, Contributions, Personal Items List and Extra Cost Items.

### • Charges: Curriculum related activities

This amount can vary from year to year and from class to class. A breakdown of estimated charges for your child's participation in excursions/ in-school activities and swimming lessons etc. for 2026 is outlined in the schedule attached. The amounts shown represent the **maximum** charges for scheduled activities in 2026. **Students may only participate if they have parental permission and have paid the charge prior to the excursion or activity by the due date.** Activities may include visiting performers, excursions, interschool sports carnival, swimming lessons and other special events.

#### Contributions

The Safety Bay Primary School Board has endorsed an amount of \$60 per student in Pre-Primary to Year 6 and \$50 per Kindergarten student, which is in line with School Education Regulations 2000. We are also offering a **discount for families.** If you have three or more children, school contributions are discounted to \$150 per family. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family contributes by supplementing funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth governments.

Your family's contribution is vital and is used to purchase materials and resources for the classroom to support learning in, literacy, numeracy, science, information communications technology, humanities and social sciences, art and physical education.

#### Personal Items List

The cost for these items will vary from year level to year level. It includes items such as stationery, pencils, crayons, scrapbooks. Parents may purchase these items from their chosen retailer or use the nominated school supplier, **Campion Education**.

You may also pay your contributions for 2026 through **Campion Education** when you order your child's Personal Items List. This contribution may also be paid via COMPASS at any time.

# • Other Voluntary Approved Requests (P&C, LIBRARY CONTRIBUTION)

The Safety Bay Primary School Board has **not** approved any requests for costs of this nature. These voluntary approved requests may relate to items such as P&C contributions in lieu of fundraising.

The South Metropolitan <b>Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC)</b> program provides extension and challenge opportunities for students deemed as eligible through state-wide testing in Year 4.
